THE PITCAIRN ISLANDERS.

THE Morayshire arrived yesterday from Norfolk Island, having conveyed thither from Pitcairn Island 194 souls descendants of the Mutineers of the Bounty, who were safely landed on the 7th of June. Three days afterwards, namely on the 10th, George Adams, the Grandson of John Adams, one of the leading Mutineers, died, and was buried with considerable ceremony.

The Revd. Mr Nobbs and the Islanders highly appreciated the assistance afforded by the officers and the few prisoners left on the Island, who remained three weeks after the arrival of the Morayshire, and gave them every information relative to the necessary agricultural operations, explaining to them the particular modes used on the Island.

Mr. Rodger, the Inspector of Stock, and Superintendent of Agriculture, is particularly mentioned, as most assiduous in his attentions to the newcomers, as, also, William Field, and the Islanders evince a great anxiety for their return, in order to afford them that assistance and information, which, as strangers, are actually necessary to their successful settlement in their new habitation. We may add, that the Revd Mr Nobbs, and the resident Magistrate, Mr Young, have petitioned the Government for aid, in carrying on the operations, mechanical and otherwise, which are so urgently required. Of the 194 who have arrived, 79 are children, the sexes amongst the adults being divided in fair proportions.

The prisoners, 5 in number, brought by the Morayshire were landed yesterday, and when she left H. M. S. Juno and Herald were off the Island.
